- →Kohl's cards can be used pay your Kohl's credit card bill (Trinity earns 4%).
- →Erbelli's has now joined the SCRIP PRO with a \$20 card (7% rebate to Trinity). It is good at both Portage and Stadium locations.
- →We have a new card with multiple Kalamazoo options on it. EMA Enterprises certificates cost \$10 (rebate of 7%) and include six local restaurants (Andrea's Cafe, Derk's, Village Inn South, Liz's Parkview Café, Michelle's, and Andrea's Café and Pizza Too).

The funds we earn through the sale of these cards support people and groups of all ages with a variety of needs. As always we thank you for helping us help others.

#### From the SWELL Partnership

(Area Lutheran churches supporting Lutheran Social Services of Michigan's Child and Family Services in SW Michigan)

We are in the process of creating a brochure describing what SWELL is and what SWELL does in hopes of encouraging other churches in SW Michigan to support us. SWELL members plan to visit churches in Van Buren County to introduce them to our program and enlist their aid.

Our most recent project was delivering the items for four Welcome Baskets to WMU for the incoming Seita Scholars (former foster children now attending WMU with scholarship assistance). We also budget for gifts and food for them during the Christmas break when many of them stay on campus because they have nowhere else to go. (A dorm is kept open for them.)

Regarding Liesl's orthodontic work: About \$600 has been donated toward the \$1800 need; SWELL has paid the entire amount our of our treasury and with these donations and funds Thrivent has contributed from their operating budget. If any of their grants are not fulfilled, Thrivent will again consider this project.

If you are saving any quart (or 30 ounce) jars for us for Cookies in a Jar, we would appreciate it if you would bring them to Trinity now. Just leave them at the SCRIP table or in the office.

# **REFLECTIONS**

We had a recent opportunity to engage in a stewardship workshop lead by Pr. Roger Hardy of the synod offices and attended by a handful of congregation representatives and pastors from here in West Michigan. We are new to this responsibility for Stewardship at Trinity and this was a total "eyes wide open" learning experience. These few words are not an opening to our typical stewardship campaign, rather a challenge to get us thinking and considering our lives within TLC.

Pointed questions asked at the workshop included "Am I being a good steward with what God has entrusted to me?, and How can I become a better steward?"

Stewardship is not all about money and how much we give to the Church. It is much larger and includes ALL the resources that God is providing to Trinity to support our mission, including our sanctuary and education building, our members, our clergy and staff, and the many hours offered by our members in support of numerous programs.

We find in 2 Corinthians 9: 8-9, "And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. As it is written, 'He has distributed freely, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures forever'"

Stewardship is about growing in our relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and resources that God has provided to us. Trinity is very blessed and it is our responsibility and obligation to use these blessings well. It is a thank you to the gift of Jesus in our lives and helps to share God's love with the world.

The questions listed earlier can also be directed toward our council leadership. Do you believe our council is acting as good stewards of the resources we employ here at Trinity? Do you have ideas on how we could do better or focus our energy differently?

With your guidance and prayers we will continue to improve as responsible stewards and servants at Trinity.


It's time to start collecting items for the <u>Christmas Child Shoeboxes!</u>

"Gather - Along The Way" is the theme for our Fall Retreat to be held on Sept. 28th and 29th. It will be based on Psalm 25:4-5 "Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God, my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long". Speaker: Casey Salmenin.

### **Gathered By God**

**Session 1: Our Present, Christ's Presence** 

Key Verse: "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." - Matthew 18:20

From beginning to end, the Bible testifies that the God who **gathers** is the same God who is **present** with us. The Gospel of Matthew adds that Jesus himself is "God with us", and promises to be with us always, wherever two or three are gathered, even to the end of the age. This promise of God's presence in Christ is true even in the messy, difficult, or conflicted times we experience among the gathered people of God. No matter the shape of our present situation, God is with us in Christ. And Christ is especially with us when we gather together.

If we never look for God, we'll never learn to recognize God's presence even as we're surrounded by it. God is never more present in our lives than when we suffer. Our God knows pain and death intimately in the person of Jesus Christ, and God promises to be with us even in our hurt. This is no remote, uncaring deity who hangs us out to dry. In 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians Chapter 1, Paul writes from his own experience about the comfort of God and suffering with Christ. Paul maintains that suffering is the occasion for experiencing the compassion of God. In Romans 8, Paul reassures us that NOTHING can separate us from the love of God. We all suffer loss and can hold tightly on to God's promises of comfort and hope. Be present, Spirit of God, within us, your dwelling place and home, that this house may be one where all darkness is penetrated by your light, all troubles calmed by your peace, all evil redeemed by your love, all pain transformed in your suffering, and all dying glorified in your risen life. Amen.

Looking ahead . . .

**October:** *Gathered to Learn* - Crowds gathered around Jesus to learn from his parables. We too gather around him to listen and learn. **Session 2: Learning the Tough Stuff** – "Again he began to teach beside the sea. Such a very large crowd gathered around him that he got into a boat on the sea and sat there, while the whole crowd was beside the sea on the land." Mark 4:1

**November:** *Gathered for Life* – We are gathered to be fed, just as the 5,000 were. And like them, we receive more than enough – abundant grace. **Session 3: Nothing Lost** – "*Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." John 6:11-12* 

**December:** *Gathered and Empowered* – In Acts, the apostles gather and the Holy Spirit comes down and gives them the power to speak the word of God. Can this still happen in the church today? **Session 4: Shake It Up** – "When they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit ad spoke the word of God with boldness." Acts 4:31
