About the visiting Theologians at Trinity!



Amy Lindeman Allen is Associate Professor of New Testament at Christian Theological Seminary and Book Review Editor for the seminary's journal, Encounter: A Journal of Theological Scholarship. She is an ordained minister in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and has served in congregations in Ohio, Pennsylvania, Nevada, and Indiana. She is currently serving as President for the professional organization, Lutheran Women in Theological and Religious Studies and preaching part-time at First Trinity Lutheran Church in Indianapolis, IN.

Allen is passionately committed to the transformative power of the gospel at the intersection of the church and world. She seeks to advance a scriptural vision for equality and justice for all people in both her professional and personal life and celebrates CTS' commitment to this vision as a central tenet of her teaching philosophy. Full of questions from an early age, Allen went to graduate school seeking answers, only to discover that there are few "right" answers, but an infinite supply of questions. Her greatest joy in teaching is exploring these questions together with students and, in the process, learning together the gift of mutual respect and compassion amidst difference.

Presently, much of Allen's work continues to focus on this burgeoning field within ideological criticism called childist criticism, seeking to locate and reclaim the voices of children from the New Testament texts. She is an active member of the Children in the Biblical World unit of the Society of Biblical Literature and has published numerous articles, book chapters, and bibliographies on children and the New Testament.



Timothy McNinch serves as Assistant Professor of Hebrew Bible at Christian Theological Seminary. He earned his PhD in Hebrew Bible from Emory University, where his dissertation focused on the compositional history of 1 Samuel 1–8. Prior to his academic career, McNinch was a church planting pastor in Michigan with the Association of Vineyard Churches (USA). He is now certified for ordination in the Presbyterian Church (USA).

Dr. McNinch's scholarship has appeared in Vetus Testamentum, Bible and Critical Theory, and Encounter. He is the series editor of the "Politics of

Scripture" blog at the Political Theology Network (<u>politicaltheology.com</u>), and series editor of the Illustrated Biblical Texts series from GlossaHouse Publishers (<u>glossahouse.com</u>). He is also the creator and co-host of the popular weekly preaching podcast, "First Reading" (<u>firstreadingpodcast.com</u>), and curates a biblical languages YouTube channel (<u>youtube.com/timmcninch</u>).

"In my capacity as a regular contributor and editor for the "Politics of Scripture" blog at The Political Theology Network, I work as part of a multiethnic and interdisciplinary team of scholars who regularly challenge me to expand the limitations I sometimes place on biblical scholarship through my own inherited lens. Working this out in another project, part of the vision for the popular podcast I co-founded, "First Reading," is to provide a platform where the work of underrepresented biblical scholars can be heard and utilized in the church world. These steps represent my intent to seek diverse mentors and steward my own privilege to transform the dynamic in my field."

-2 Corinthians 5:17

As the April showers bring forth May flowers, we cannot help but lean into the promise of new life that the season of spring brings. This is the cyclical covenant of Creation, that from death, we have new life. The buds on the trees and the daffodils are here to declare that spring is finally here!

May also brings the conclusion of Eastertide – the extended celebration of the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
