
#### Matrix Campus Ministry Interns at

"For six years you shall sow your land and gather in its yield; but the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow..." -Exodus 23:10

As you likely know, at the end of August I returned from Sabbatical. While having three kids and visiting more than my share of airports I can't

exactly say that it was a time for me to "rest and lie fallow", it was a time of refreshing and renewal. My family and I were blessed with the time and resources to reconnect with one another and build memories together while exploring our faith, history, and the beauty of God's creation.

The word Sabbatical comes from our biblical word Sabbath meaning "to rest" and it is a consistent theme and command throughout scripture. The above verse refers to giving the land a time of rest one year out of every seven, and by default giving everyone else a rest from planting, tending, harvesting, and selling during that year. The following verses tell God's people to do work on six days, but to rest on the seventh. And elsewhere (Leviticus 26:34), the people are warned that if they do not keep the commands of God, they will be exiled and the land will get it's sabbath without them...which it did, and they are even told that whoever does any work on the sabbath shall be put to death! (Seems a bit harsh, right!?)

Thankfully, we have a new understanding of the Law through Jesus, who reinterpreted what the Sabbath means through his actions and taught that we were not made to serve the sabbath, but the sabbath was made to serve us (Mark 2:27). So, needless to say, I am grateful to say that we do not need to get the gallows out for anyone who works on Saturday. However, even without the threat of capital punishment, we ought to still take God's command to heart as we recognize the truth that this command is for our good.

We all know the value of a good rest. As individuals, rest can bring peace and clarity, it can renew relationships and improve our health. But God's command to sabbath isn't only aimed at individuals, instead it includes the entire community and all creation, especially those outsiders or strangers in our midst. Exodus 23:12 commands a day of sabbath "so that your ox and donkey may have relief and your homeborn slave and the resident alien may be refreshed", and Exodus 23:10 commands a year of sabbath, "so that the poor of your people may eat; and what they leave, the wild animals may eat". So God's command to sabbath is a command to take care of ourselves, but more than that it's a command to care for all people and all creation.

Throughout my sabbatical, I was a stranger in many places and was blessed to experience both rest for myself and the incredible hospitality and care of others. It is my hope that we can all find ways to make time for Sabbath rest in our lives and in doing so, we might experience and share hospitality, care, and renewal with all God's people.
