Opportunities from the TLC Green Team

The Green Team continues to seek a leader for this group. We have many ideas and just need someone to help organize us. It's a great group of people, come check us out!

Recycling Update from the Green Team

The Green Team is busy working to improve the ways that Trinity can foster a culture of environmental education and stewardship. To this end, you may have noticed the new blue trash bins that are marked for recycling. Please put only clean paper, magazines, empty and dry plastic bottles and containers, aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles and jars and flattened cardboard in these bins. Put items loosely in the bin: not bagged. If you are unsure if your item is acceptable, refer to the posted information sheet near or on the bin.

Do not put trash or garbage in these bins as it will contaminate everything.

What to do with all the other plastic coming into your home? Plastic film is everywhere!! This film includes produce bags, store bags, ice bags, Ziploc and other reclosable bags, cereal box liners, case overwrap (think of that raft of toilet paper or paper towels or multi-water bottles), bread bags, newspaper sleeves, bubble wrap, and air pillows (deflated). Phew!! That is a lot of plastic! Watch for new bins at Trinity for these items or collect them in grocery store bags and return them to D&W, Meijer, Walmart or Target yourself.

Let's all work together to take care of the world that God has entrusted to us.

Trinity's Solar Panel Overview from the Green Team

Our solar panel system is on track to generate ~22kWh for the year 2024. With the system now paid off, this generation translates to ~\$3,500 in savings on our electric bill (this savings essentially cuts our bill in half). 22kWh of generated solar power saves ~18,500 lbs of CO2.

To put that into perspective one (1) kWh provides enough power to cook in an oven for 30 minutes, run a dishwasher for 1 hour, run a refrigerator for 3 hours, power a Playstation for 7 hours, or watch a 50" LED TV for 20 hours. One (1) MWh provides enough energy to power a home for 1.2 months, drive an electric vehicle 3,600 miles, power two 60-watt lightbulbs non-stop for a year, smelt 137 pounds of aluminum, toast 89,000 slices of bread, run a pool pump for 5 months, or run two refrigerators for a year. NOW THATS A LOT OF POWER!

<u>Visiting Writer Series:</u> This summer the KNC brought author Robin Wall Kimmerer to Kalamazoo for a well attended talk based on her book, Braiding Sweetgrass. Kimmerer's interests include not only restoration of ecological communities, but restoration of our relationships to land. She is returning to KVCC for their Visiting Writers Series. Two different free presentations will occur in the KVCC auditorium on November 6th at 10am and 2:15pm. Tickets are required and can be found on KVCC's website. There will also be a free community book discussion at Kalamazoo Valley Museum on Nov. 2, 2024 at 1pm.



"I was glad when they said to me, 'let us go to the House of the Lord!" Psalm 122 v.1

On the first Sunday in Advent, December 4th1904, 30 charter members gathered in a rented room over a store on North Burdick Street to share the Word and Sacrament as Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church was organized and founded. Over 4 or 5 generations and 120 years have passed, and still the Good News of Jesus Christ remains central to our mission.

In 1904 the population of Kalamazoo was about 25,000. Heritage Hall at WMU was built the same year. K College had a total of 219 students. Gibson Guitar was only 2 years old. Teddy Roosevelt had just been elected President. A historic flood had deluged the downtown (some things never change). In 1906 a chapel on West Cedar was dedicated, and in 1928 our present church was dedicated.

Some other facts in the US from 1904:

- -the average life expectancy was 47 years
- -the American flag had 45 stars
- -8,000 cars in the whole country, only 144 miles of paved roads
- -only 14 percent of homes had the luxury of a bathtub
- -only 8 percent had a telephone
- -Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa and Tennessee were more populated than California
- -the population in Las Vegas was 30
- -More than 95 percent of all births took place in the home
- -Most women only washed their hair once a month, and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo
- -only 6 percent of all American adults had graduated high school
- -the Eiffel Tower was the tallest structure in the world
