#### Invitation to Connect with Scripture through the Daily Lectionary

With the coming of Advent comes a new liturgical year and a new year of readings. The cycle of readings we follow through the year each Sunday at Trinity comes from the Revised Common Lectionary, which is used by a wide variety of mainline protestant churches around the world. Did you know that in addition to our Sunday readings, the Lectionary provides readings for every day of the year? The reading are short, so they don't take long to read and they are a great way to ground ourselves and create a habit of connect with Scripture in a meaningful way every day of the week!

If you're not the digital type, the lectionary is also listed in the back of our church hymnals on page 1121.

Whether you use the lectionary or another devotional practice, we encourage to pause in your daily routine to engage with scripture and recognize the presence and promise of God in our midst.

#### Free Online Learning Opportunity through our Synod!

Join our friend, Rev. Dr. Amy Lindeman Allen (daughter of Jim and Chris Allen and theologian in residence at Trinity in June 2024!) and Indiana Christian Church Associate Professor of New Testament at Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, Indiana, for a six-week course titled, "Jesus and the Little Children"! Based on Dr. Allen's book, The Gifts They Bring: How Children in the Gospels Can Shape Inclusive Ministry (WJK, 2023), sessions will include presentations on the following topics:

The Gift of Participation: Little Children as Proprietors of the Realm of God

The Gift of Proclamation: The Bethlehem Shepherds

The Gift of Advocacy: James and John, Fisherfolk

The Gift of Listening: Mary at the Feet of Jesus

The Gift of Partnership: A Son and His Mother at Nain



"For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

-Isaiah 9:6

December is a busy month in the church, and it's often just as busy or busier in our homes. It's a time full of festivities, traditions, parties, family gatherings, and more. This year however, as we enter the season of Advent, we are coming off a national election that has brought the divisions among us into sharp focus rather than all that we hold in common. As a result, many are approaching all that this season brings with a fair amount of anxiety and trepidation. We worry that we will either be confronted with views that we deeply and personally oppose, or that we will do or say something that will harm relationships with those we love. This tense and divisive political environment has threatened our relationships as well as the joy with which we long to approach this season. Some may say that it's a mess...but in a way that's what the Christmas season is about.

Christmas is a time that we celebrate the coming of Christ; and Christ didn't enter into a pristine world void of conflict and rich with of healthy relationships centered on mutual affection and care for the less fortunate ...Jesus entered into our mess. 2024-ish years ago in the midst of Roman occupation, the Judean people experienced political and religious division, poverty, and oppression...and Jesus entered into their mess. It's not a stretch to imagine the tense conversations at first century dinner tables as a puppet king (Herod) served at the pleasure of an occupying force, building wealth at the expense of his people. But amidst the divisions and challenges of that time Jesus entered into their mess. And this month we celebrate that regardless of whatever messes we continue to make, Jesus remains among us.

The prophet Isaiah says in the above verse, "...a child has been born for us, a son given to us... and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Luke recalls how at the birth of Jesus, the angelic heavenly host proclaimed "Peace, and good will..." to the shepherds. Jesus comes into our mess, and he comes not to divide or condemn, but he comes to bring peace...and as "Mighty God" and "Everlasting Father" he has the authority to do so.

So, no matter what your holiday plans look like and no matter how unified or divided your family and friends may be, may you find deep peace this season in who Christ is and what Christ has done. Because of the promise and hope that we celebrate this season, may we be a people of peace; a people who work for peace, and a people who experience peace. For Christ is with us, in our mess and always.
