We build connections in our community through the efforts of the Christ Clothes Closet, the Food Pantry, multiple blood drives with the Red Cross, and many other special service efforts and events. We give thanks for the incredible work and dedication of the volunteers who give so much to make these things happen! In addition, we serve our neighbors and build up our community by opening our building to groups such as the Center for Transformation, VASA, Sons of Norway, Swell, PEO, the Kalamazoo Pipe Band, and others. In our efforts to keep people housed and warm, our Good Samaritan fund has given away nearly \$10,000 this year in rent and utility assistance and as a way to be more effective in this effort we have connected with Kalamazoo Housing Advocates, a neighborhood organization that walks with those in need in a way that we cannot. We also build community through a variety of fellowship and small group opportunities including Meetings of the Men & Women, Beer & Hymns, Scripture & Sandwiches, Oktoberfest, and the Men's and Women's Retreats. And to top it all off, we are blessed with a wonderful staff, a thriving Youth and family ministry, and an abundance of children!

All this and more makes it a true blessing to be a part of this particular "cloud of witnesses" at Trinity as we share relationship with one another and continually reach out to build connections in the community and beyond!

REPORT OF THE TRINITY EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH FOUNDATION

I am happy to provide this report on behalf of the Directors of the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Foundation. Members of the Board, in addition to me are: Pastor Johnson, Pastor Lehman, Gary Kent-Bracken, Tina Adams, Julie Bosley and Keith Peterson. We continue to also receive guidance and support from Jerry Molitor, whose expertise continues to be a vital part of the success of our program.

Despite the continued prevalence of inflation and the highs and lows of an election year, the Foundation balance sheet has continued to grow, serving as a continued source of income for the church; as of the end of the year the Foundation was working with assets in excess of \$1,700,000. We have made some adjustments to the holdings of the Foundation over the last year, altering our holdings to reflect funds that have been more effective recently, as well as working to manage our asset allocation to reflect a healthy mixture of stable funds and growth. We continue to use a disciplined, non-reactionary approach based on long-term goals. Our increase in assets has allowed the foundation to increase their quarterly contributions to the church - over the last year the Foundation has contributed \$40,000 to the general fund.

The Trinity Foundation continues to be a bedrock of stability for the church, allowing our congregation the financial freedom to carry out its mission within the community while being able to rely on the continued impact of the generous gifts of those who have made the Foundation exist. At this point in its existence the Foundation has made distributions of over \$1,190,000 for the continued mission of Trinity Lutheran Church.

Contributions of over \$1,100,000 have been made to Trinity Lutheran Church. Included in these contributions are:

• Over \$690,000 to the Annual General and Building funds, for support and expansion of ongoing ministries at Trinity.

Significant support for Special Projects, Including:

- Brick repair and replacement
- Purchase and Installation of the original elevator
- Construction of the Handicap Restroom
- Renovation of the Kitchen
- Repair and Expansion of the Organ
- Replacement of the Boiler
- Renovation of Fellowship Hall
- Purchase and removal of Cedar Street House
- Roof and Window Repair and Replacement (several times)
- Re-surfacing of the Parking Lot (twice)
- Repairs to Rental Property prior to Donation
- Repair of the Stained Glass Window in the Organ Loft
- Funding Support for Sabbaticals (Ongoing)
- Support of several Capital Campaigns including Enter, Elevate and Gather
- Scholarship support through "Lutheran Graduate Study" fund
- Support of the Summer Concert Series
- Renovations in the Parsonage

The gift we received from Elva Lovell over twenty-eight years ago, along with the many additional contributions we have received, (over \$300,000) has had a significant and positive impact on our congregation and the expansion of our ministry. In many cases, the projects noted above could

not have been undertaken without the support provided by the Foundation. I believe we have indeed been Good Stewards of these gifts.

One of my responsibilities as a Director of the Foundation is to seek additional contributions to the Foundation. I would therefore be remiss if I didn't ask: "Have you considered a gift to support the future of Trinity Lutheran Church through your Foundation?" Please consider this possibility and especially consider providing for Trinity in your Estate Planning as Elva Lovell so unselfishly did.

There are many ways you can include Trinity in your current and future financial and estate planning. Providing for the Trinity Foundation directly in your Will is the most common method. There are however many other ways, including: Charitable Gift Annuities, Deferred Payment Charitable Gift Annuities and Charitable Remainder Trusts, to name just a few. If you would like more information about these programs, please feel free to get in contact with one of the members of the Foundation Board or one of the Pastors, and we will be happy to give you any guidance that we can..

We give thanks for these wonderful gifts and pray for God's continued guidance and blessing as Good Stewards of them.

Annual Report of the Organist/Director of Music

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the lands; Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Psalm 100: 1-2

I am honored to have been called to provide the worship music as Trinity's Organist & Music Director for the past three years. It continues to be an amazing experience for me!

I ended my 2023 report by saying that my goal for 2024 was to get more of God's people involved in the music of the church. With His help and the help of so many of the good people of Trinity, I am pleased to say that we have

succeeded! I accompanied four of Trinity's high school students in playing their instruments for church services and two of them also played their instruments with the choir. Debbie Harding and Jennifer Gatz have provided music for the 8:30 a.m. services during the year. Don Anderson led the sung liturgy for midweek Lenten Vespers. Negar Afazel and her husband Jon Barnes played the violin and cello during the year. This past spring, Negar received her doctorate in violin performance from the Peabody Music Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. Trinity is blessed to have these talented musicians who are eager to praise the Lord with their God-given gifts.

Trinity's choir had another busy and successful year. We provided music for regular Sunday services during the year. In addition to Sunday services, we presented a Good Friday Choral Tenebrae and Advent/Christmas Lessons & Carols services. Even during the summer, we stayed busy with a "pick-up choir" on two Sundays. Our "pick-up choir" met immediately before each of the two services for a short rehearsal. Unfortunately, our choir is half the size that it was before the COVID pandemic. We have fourteen on our roster and our average attendance is eleven. While our numbers are small, I am pleased to say that our choir is made up of committed Christians who sing their hearts out to praise God! I want to recognize and thank every single one of them:

We reconfigured the organ loft during the year to add flexibility to serve our needs better than previously. We are using instruments with the choir more frequently than we had in the past so we removed the pews on the north side of the loft to accommodate instruments (brass quintet, strings, etc.). New chairs specifically designed for choirs were donated by a generous choir couple and were placed near the center of the loft, to the south of the organ console. Having many of the choir members in chairs, rather than in pews, gives us additional flexibility. Come up to the loft and take a look at the new setup!

Musical highlights of 2024

- The choir provided music for the Ash Wednesday service.
- Don Anderson and I led the music for the mid-week Lenten Vespers services.
- Negar Afazel & Jon Barnes continued leading a student string ensemble, performing several times during the year, including Palm Sunday.
- The choir presented the Good Friday Choral Tenebrae service and Bruce Uchimura performed cello works by J.S. Bach.
- Jesse Lemons provided musical strength and beauty with his trumpet for our three Easter Sunday morning services and our choir sang for two of the Easter services.
- Negar Afazel received her doctorate in violin performance in May.
- The choir sang for Sunday morning services through June 23
- Deb and I hosted an end-of-the-year choir picnic at our home on June 23.
- The choir sang on two summer Sundays as a "pick-up choir."
- After a restful summer, the choir resumed on September 8.
- The organ was tuned and serviced on December 4.
- The West Michigan BrassWorks provided music for our 120th Anniversary service on December 8.
- The choir presented the Lessons & Carols services on December 15, singing several anthems and the cantata "In Dulci Jubilo" (Now Sing We, Now Rejoice) by Dietrich Buxtehude at each service.
- The choir sang for the 7:00 p.m. service on Christmas Eve'.
- Deb and I hosted a Christmas party for the choir on January 3, 2025.

I want to thank Pastors Ken & Jake for their leadership and support during the year. Also, a special thank-you goes to my predecessor, Bill Musselman, for his counsel and friendship as well as his playing the organ and piano for many of our worship services. Many thanks to our choir members who have spent countless hours at the church practicing for our worship services. Many thanks to so many of God's people here at Trinity who have enriched our worship services by sharing their God-given musical talents.

My goal for the New Year, 2025, is to get even more of God's people involved in singing and playing music in praise of Him who gives us something to sing about in Jesus Christ our Lord!

Youth Ministry 2024 Annual Report

Youth Ministry began the year with Lindsay Casey as the Youth Director, however, she regretfully resigned during the month of March. I took over the reins as Youth Director once more in the month of April.

In April, Pastor Jake led the youth with a movie night, complete with a game of Sardines. They were also invited to the Family Ministry Game Night. In May, the youth traveled to Fennville and went horseback riding, which was so much fun on a beautiful day!! Due to low numbers, we canceled our Gaming Day activity in June, but vowed to have one again soon.

We had seven youth and children attend Stony Lake Lutheran Camp in June. Four of our youth attended the first week and Vicar Megan took three youth to camp at Stony Lake Lutheran Camp during the second week. At the end of May and beginning of June, we took orders for new Trinity t-shirts. The shirts look cool and the income helped our youth group budget. The shirts were distributed in June. We collected a few hundred dollars and were able to purchase many batteries that went into Hurricane Relief Kits for people living in New Orleans.

In August, the youth helped the Christian Ed and Family Ministry with the Vacation Bible School. They helped guide the families, helped with preparing and serving meals, and with clean up. In September, we had a Youth Group Planning Meeting and planned out our coming year. We decided to have

Annual Report of Christian Education

2024 began with the re-election of Ashley Wineland as a co-chair on the Christian Education team. Sally Morris continued to serve with Ashley. Youth Director Lindsay Casey stepped down from her role to focus on her new fulltime job, so Heidi Albertson agreed to expand her work as the Director of a combined Family & Youth Ministry. Vicar Megan Floyd was also an integral part of our team during her internship.

The weekly adult bible study met in the lounge on Sunday mornings, and the Men's Bible study on Wednesday mornings. "Scripture & Sandwiches" met via Zoom throughout the winter and concluded a multi-year study of each book of the Bible.

In conjunction with Pr. Jake's Sabbatical, the congregation hosted two Visiting Theologians in June. Amy Lindeman Allen hosted 7 different talks: A Christmas in June intergenerational Study on Luke 2; the discussion *Reading the Bible with and for Children*; a Theology on Tap *Whose Kingdom is it anyway? Jesus and the Little Children* (also offered in a second session with root beer for families); men's bible study *Generations of Fisherfolk: James, John and Zebedee;* women's bible study *Generations of Service: Mary and Martha at the feet of Jesus';* a Scripture & Sandwiches *Children in the Bible and its Contexts.*

Tim McNinch visited the following week. He hosted the men's bible study Political Theology: How can we read political scriptures in our political season?; Theology on Tap "The Bible is a Perfectly Poured Guinness"; Scripture & Sandwiches "Dining in the Dark" Explore the meaning of the darkness at Jesus' Crucifixion; Women's bible study Casual Conversation about feminist interpretation of the Hebrew Bible; a 3 session Bible Dig-In on the book of Ruth; and a Sunday School class on how to get the most out of the Bible as adult readers.

Many of our children attend Living Waters Ministry Camp at Stony Lake in June. Trinity assisted with paying 50% of each camper's fee. Men from our congregation joined in a retreat at Camp Arcadia. Trinity hosted a women's retreat on a Sunday afternoon in August led by Kara Haug, focused on building relationships. Heidi Albertson accompanied 3 Youth to the National Gathering

in New Orleans. Youth also attended the Living Waters Charge gathering in Traverse City in November. The Vacation Bible School theme was 'Olympics' and held over three Wednesday nights in August. Thank-you to all the many volunteers who prepared food and shared crafts, songs, and games.

A Rally Sunday Hello & Jello Party in the new gathering space kicked-off the 2024 Sunday School programming year in September; we have over 40 children enrolled. A sincere thank you to all our many faithful teachers and classroom helpers. Emily Wright is teaching the preschool/kindergarten class, assisted by Bess Fitzgerald and Jennifer Greenman. Ashley Wineland teaches the elementary schoolers, assisted by Jim Magerlein. Pr. Jake Lehman holds Confirmation Class for the middle schoolers during the Education hour, while Jason Grubaugh holds bible study for the High school youth. Heidi Albertson hosts a Parent Small group in the Family Ministry room every other Sunday. Her Infant/toddler Group was not as well attended this fall, and has been discontinued for now.

Increased Sunday school attendance meant the need for more classroom space this year. Working with the librarians, we were able to combine the supply closet and library processing room, allowing us to move the Preschool class upstairs to the third floor. The bathrooms on this level were then equipped with toddler seats and stepstools so the children could be comfortable with these facilities. Thank you to Maryann Hubble, Mary Bittner, and Katie Grubaugh for all their hard work with this project.

Reformation Day was celebrated with a combined Sunday school class party celebrating our Lutheran roots. Thank you to Deb Mattson for demonstrating her printing press for us and letting the children experience making their own prints.

The children's Christmas program in December shared the good news of the season during the 11am worship service, replacing the Sermon for the morning. Youth helpers also took the lead on different roles – greeting, playing music, and ushering. Thank you to Jim Magerlein for stage direction and Deb Harding for piano accompaniment.

2024 Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Facilities Report.

Significant facilities highlights from 2024:

- 1. Shaun Wright completed a feasibility study and cost analysis for **upgrading our electrical system**. The council and congregation voted to approve the \$49,645 cost to move forward with the upgrades. We are currently reviewing additional quotes and options from more electrical firms to ensure we are moving forward with the best option for the church. The primary needs for an upgraded electrical system are:
 - a) **Increased capacity**. We have been told by several electrical firms that our system is maxed out and cannot take any new, significant electrical loads. This is particularly important as we investigate opportunities to install central air conditioning in the education wing. No such installation can be considered without first upgrading the church's electrical system.
 - b) **Risk mitigation**. Our current breaker panels are so old that it would be difficult or impossible to replace a breaker if/when one goes bad.
- 2. Our **solar panel system** is on track to generate ~22kWh for the year 2024. With the system now paid off, this generation translates to ~\$3,500 in savings on our electric bill (this savings essentially cuts our bill in half). 22kWh of generated solar power saves ~18,500 lbs of CO2.
- 3. Oct 12th workday was extraordinarily productive. Highlights include: Paula and Chuck deep cleaning/refreshing the fellowship hall; Judy and Laura leading a team to garden and clean our outdoor spaces; Rodney, Steve, Nate, Larry, and Dave knocking out a plethora of handyman tasks to include winterizing the window air conditioners; and a team of men led by Rodney carefully relocating a pew over the side of the choir loft and down to the basement.

What to expect in 2025

- 1. **Roof work over the Sacristy.** Significant water leaking started coming in from the roof over the Sacristy. We are currently executing a minor contract to patch the leak (under \$1k) but will explore options to conduct more long-term repairs in the spring (long term roof repairs cannot be conducted in the winter).
- 2. **Continued work on our repair list**. Please continue to add repair needs as you see them to the lists in the fellowship hall and next to the office. These lists get digitized regularly and are the primary documents used when executing workdays. At a minimum we will have another spring and fall workday but will also target to have minor word days to attack these repairs.
- 3. **Digitizing our facility's needs, history, and schedules**. The purpose of this repository is to:
 - a) Allow any member of the congregation to step into the facilities team and quickly gain an understanding of how our facilities are managed, what the needs are, and who the resources are for addressing those needs.
 - b) Connect facilities needs with our talented and capable members of the congregation willing to work on those needs.

2023 SERVICE MINISTRY ANNUAL REPORT

Guided by God's call to love and serve our neighbors, the Service Ministry team shall lead the congregation in meeting the physical and spiritual needs of people of all ages and socioeconomic status in our local community and globally.

- <u>Salvation Army Angel Tree</u>-- We donated 23 gifts, 2 bicycles with helmets and 10 gift cards to children who otherwise may not have had a bright Christmas.
- <u>Christs Clothes Closet</u>— The clothes closet is serving, on average 40 families a week with first time clients coming every week. The winter coat giveaway was a great success. We had 78 people come, representing 196 family members. The need for personal care items is also great. In December we gave out 4 or more items, depending on what was donated, to 67 people.
- Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes I am pleased to report that we were able to send off 59 shoeboxes this year. We had a lot of help and I want to thank these helpers especially: Margaret Stevenson, Teri Barrett, Becky Matyas, Marie Belleville, senior youth group Kaitlyn, Elyse, Kiley, Miryam and Jaxon. There were so many helping with shoeboxes and funds that I can't possibly name them all! The gifts are on their way and need our prayers that the children feel the love of God and want to continue to learn about Jesus through "The Greatest Journey". Blessings too to all who will be doing the delivering. Christmas joy to you all! - Linda Ward, coordinator
 - <u>Bingo at Ministry with Community</u> Monthly Bingo at the Ministry with Community homeless drop-in center continues thanks to faithful volunteers and Scripts donations. We gather 6-7 totes of prizes and set up on the second Tuesday of every month. This year we have had 14 to 24 participants and friendly play. Winners choose snacks, reading glasses, toiletries, crossword books or art supplies to take with them. I am grateful for time face-to-face with poor neighbors and a window into another world at the corner of Ransom and Edwards streets. I will continue to lead the effort (by making a monthly trip to the Dollar Tree and joining one of four rotating volunteers each month) through May of this year. Please consider putting your time toward this work of the church in the future. - Bess Fitzgerald
- <u>SCRIP Program</u> (gift cards) In 2024 profits from the sale of gift cards were used to continue to purchase BINGO prizes for Ministry with Community, to match the \$404.25 donated by Trinity for batteries for the Youth Gathering, to provide Meijer cards for the refugees, to support the Christ Closet, and to assist individuals and families with various needs. In addition to sales, we received several donations. We are grateful for your support!

<u>S.W.E.L.L.</u> *<u>Sharing With Everyone Lutheran Love</u> (Area Lutheran churches supporting Samaritas foster care)


We are a volunteer group sponsored by area Lutheran churches and other generous donations. Our purpose is to support our local foster care program through Samaritas (formerly Lutheran Social Services of MI - LSSM) and others in our community. Although this year Samaritas was going through a major transition, SWELL was still able to give each child in their foster system a birthday card and a gift card. Former foster care youth now living independently but still supervised by Samaritas (ILP) were also included in our budget for their special needs. We donated \$250 for meals for Seita Scholars at WMU who were on campus during Christmas break. We also provided clothing, diapers and other items as requested.

Special note: Again this year Trinity's Service Ministry Team furnished backpacks filled with school supplies and toiletries for all high school, middle school and elementary students in Samaritas' care. These were very welcome. Thanks to all who donated!

- <u>Book Cart at MWC</u> The Ministry with Community book cart is continuing each week. Connections this year with other D.O.C.C. churches and the Friends of the Library Bookstore have helped to supply some of the nearly 500 books that were checked out this year!
- <u>Prison Ministry</u> The prison ministry has grown again this year. Regular communication has continued with nearly three dozen incarcerated individuals and an additional 25 were added this year. 22 of the incarcerated individuals are from Kalamazoo, mostly in state correctional facilities and two in the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Communication is maintained with electronic JPay messages, cards and letters, phone calls from the facilities and video visits with a Kalamazoo woman at the women's facility in Ypsilanti. The communication specifics were as follows: 267 messages sent, 270 received, 10 letters sent, 20 letters received, 38 birthday cards sent, 10 phone calls received and 2 visits were conducted.

One Thrivent grant submitted by a Trinity member this year enhanced the prison ministry. It supplied much sought after, but often too expensive to order, art/craft supplies for five individuals. Each recipient was truly grateful. One was a former student who had his artwork on display this spring at the Prison Creative Arts Project at U of M. Another Kalamazoo woman used her yarn to crochet me a gift of thanks. – Jennifer Gougeon-Catarino

- Quilters The quilters had a great year!! No snow days!! Our faithful crew of 10-16 met every fourth and fifth Thursday, except November and December. We were blessed with some great donations of fabric from folks who are closing down their quilting hobby. Tim Kilma was especially amazing in converting much of this yardage into squares for the quilts. Maridel Greer faithful sewed up the smaller scraps into beautiful quilt tops. We always accept donations of cotton and cotton/polyester fabric that is at least 11 inches wide. In October, Dave Grubaugh helped to transport 134 quilts to St. Michael for shipping to Lutheran World Relief. Thanks to all (and my apologies to anyone I missed): Naomi Frisbie, Marianne Fuerst, Jennifer Gougeon-Catarino, Maridel Greet, Jeannie Grubaugh, Kathy Hall, Betsy Kelly, Lisa Kenz, Joyce Magerlein, Judy Morison, Sharon Padgett, Kim Tilma, Sandy Wallace, Margaret Stevens, Becky Matyas and Carol Malmud.
- Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry This has been a year of both good and bad for Trinity's Kalamazoo Loaves and Fishes pantry. The good news is that we were able to serve many more customers than in previous years, while the bad news is that there always seem to be more of our neighbors with unmet food needs. As shown in the accompanying graph, our service numbers have significantly increased over the past year.



In total, we provided food to 1668 individuals in 2024 compared to 792 in 2023. When we look at the number of repeat customers and the high percent

of our customers who walk, it appears that we have established a very loyal neighborhood clientele.

A big thank you from our pantry team and all of our clients to the congregation for your generous support. With your assistance, we are able to supply our customers with food items that are frequently unavailable through KLF, including eggs, a selection of cereals, and a variety of snack items.
