### Message from the Church Council.

In 2024, our Council undertook a Visioning process to set goals for the next 3 years. All members brought in ideas, one of which was to increase Council communication and transparency with our congregation. As a result, I will provide monthly summaries of Council activity for this newsletter.

The Council met on January 12.

The Visioning strategies were discussed. Four action items were updated:

- 1) an emergency food dispensary has been established to insure people in need have access to food even when the church and our pantry are not open. This dispensary is on Oak Street and is being monitored by Rasma McMullen and Sandy Wallace. Members may leave food contributions for the dispensary in the basket at the entrance to Fellowship Hall.
- 2) Electrical system updates approved at the Congregational Budget Meeting are proceeding, with two contractors to provide proposals. Max Wineland is managing this process.
- 3) Interior signs is being assessed to ensure Members and guests know where to find things in our building. This review is being performed by Jen Gatz, Rasma McMullen and Sandy Wallace.
- 4) Sharing Council information with the Congregation will be done monthly by the Council President. As part of this effort toward transparency, all Members are invited attend monthly Council meetings. Our next Council Meeting will be held on February 23, 2025 at 12:15 p.m. in the Church Lounge.

The Council uses a "consent agenda" where each ministry submits a written report about their activities for the past month. The Secretary sends out a copy of these reports to all Council Members for review prior to the meeting. if there are no questions/comments about these reports, they are adopted and accepted. The saved meeting time is used to discuss future events, ideas, suggestions, etc.

This month we talked about the church's financial year end, concluding in a positive position! Pastor Jake brought up the 2025 CROP Hunger Walk which will begin and end in the Trinity parking lot on April 27. Holly Wohlfert reminded us that the Kalamazoo Gleaners is beginning operations this month and is looking for volunteers. Please go to their web site for more information.

The February Annual Congregational Meeting will be on Feb 2 in the church after second service. It will be chaired by Ashley Wineland, Vice President.

The cornerstone of the church on the northeast has the date of 1904. This was when the congregation was founded and why we recently celebrated the 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The building itself was not begun until 1926 and completed in 1927. So the structure approaches 100 years old. We have a beautiful sanctuary dedicated to the worship of God. As with any old building maintenance and upkeep becomes an ongoing concern.

The mission of spreading the Gospel and Good News of Christ, and the people of the church are of primary importance. The facility and structure supports that primary goal. Through the years we have replaced the church roof, brickwork, updated Altar area/Fellowship Hall/Kitchen/Gathering area in addition to numerous other projects. Several areas of our facility have once again been highlighted as in need of updating and repair. Our electrical system is over 50 years old. Areas of plaster are deteriorating (especially Cedar St. entrance). Some of the flat roofs have leaks and are detaching from walls.

In the coming weeks more information will be forthcoming as we move to address these structural upgrades and needs. Trinity continues to prioritize and be a very vibrant center of mission and outreach. God has blessed us through the past 120 years, and now we plan for the next coming years and decades. We continue to have new drams and visions of how we might best bring the Light of Christ into the world!
