

CROP Hunger Walks raise money for <u>Church World Service</u> hunger/ poverty reduction projects locally (~25%) and internationally (~75%). This year our local funds will go to Loaves & Fishes food pantry. The steps we take and the funds we raise together provide life-saving support including emergency

food and resources, along with the seeds, tools and programs that help families feed themselves in the future. \$1 provides 10 meals through local partners in the U.S., \$15 provides chickens for a family in Tanzania, \$30 provides a household water filter for a family in Cambodia...there are so many ways to love our neighbors. Help us end global hunger one step at a time!

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'" -Matthew 25:37-39

At times, our faith can seem like a complicated thing and questions about how to live out our faith can seem even more confusing and complex. We struggle with how to think about political issues; we worry about when and how to act in regard to social challenges; we disagree with people who we care for and respect and wonder if we've got it right, or if they do, or if nobody does. In a world that very often calls us to take sides, we can at times feel stuck in the middle.

Believe it or not, this is not a new problem. People in Jesus' time were challenged by the same kinds of concerns. They lived with political, religious, and personal turmoil and struggled with ideas of what it meant to live faithfully in the midst of those things.

When addressing his followers, Jesus had a wonderful way of simplifying what it meant to live a life of faith in a way that boiled things down to what was most essential. We see this clearly in the above verses as Jesus describes a scene where the sheep are separated from the goats. After the king commends the sheep for providing for him when he was hungry, thirsty, naked, sick, and imprisoned, the righteous ask, "When did we do this?". The king tells them "Just as you did it for the least of these...you did it for me."

This is a simple and powerful reminder that despite all of the confusing and complex issues in our lives and the world, our mandate is clear. Feed the hungry, refresh those who thirst, clothe the naked, tend to the sick, visit the prisoner. In short, we are freed to care for the least of these; to love our neighbor as ourselves...and there is no shortage of opportunity to do that. At Trinity, opportunities to care for the "least of these" are never far away. Volunteers, funds, and items are needed to care for the refugee families that we have welcomed to Kalamazoo. Donations of time and items (clothing, food, and personal care) are welcome at the Clothes Closet or Food Pantry. Our Good Samaritan Fund which is used to assist our neighbors with things like rent and utilities has run very low and is in need of funds. And if you're not in a position to give time or funds, simply sit with one of our neighbors who has come in on a Sunday morning for some warmth and a cup of coffee.

Sometimes our life of faith can be complex, but I encourage us all to remember that it doesn't have to be. We are wholly and eternally loved by God and because of that, we are freed to share that love with our neighbors. So in the midst of this complicated world, I hope we can all take a moment to pause and thank God for the love we receive and are blessed to share.
